<u>Key Vocabulary</u>	
Money	Coins or notes that are used to pay for goods and services.
Coin	A small, flat (often circular) piece of metal used as money.
Pound	A British coin with the value of 100 pence.
Penny	The smallest value coin. It is small, circular and bronze coloured.
Note	A piece of paper which is used as money and is often the shape of a rectangle.
Pay	To give money in exchange for goods or services.
Change	Extra money given back to you after you have paid.
Cost	How much money you need to pay for goods.
Total	The amount of money you need to pay for the cost of more than one item added together.
Till	A money drawer in a store or bank.
Cashier	The person who you pay in a shop.
Shop	A building where you go to buy something.
Shopping list	A list of items you need to buy from a shop.
Café	A small restaurant where you can buy simple food and drinks.
Menu	A list in a café or restaurant which tells you what you can order and how much it costs.
Ingredients	A list of goods needed to make something.
Weigh	To measure the heaviness of something by using scales.
Grams/kilograms	The units of measure for weight.
Bake	To heat something in the oven.
Utensil	A tool used for cooking.
Oven	A hot machine in a kitchen to bake food.
