We use and rely on lots of signs and symbols.

We can see signs and symbols in our house, school, streets, town and church.

Signs and symbols help us to remember people and things.

<u>Baptism</u>

White clothes are often worn in baptism as a sign of a special occasion. Water is a sign of making things clean. A candle reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world. A cross is drawn as a sign that we are welcomed into God's church and family.



Remembrance

Lots of people wear a poppy during November to show they are remembering people who were injured or died in war.



Many soldiers sacrificed their lives for their country and the hope of a better future.

During November we also remember people we know and love who have died. The Armistice was signed at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month in

1918. It signalled the end of world war one.
Often people have 2 minutes silence at 11am on 11th November to show they are remembering.
