## Word Games

- Use spelling lists - don't just learn the spellings, talk about the words and what they mean, put them in sentences.
- When doing reading - find a word that means something similar, can you think of a word that rhymes with..., find a word you don't know the meaning of, what was your favourite word, let's change it for a different word.
- Pick a category - things made of metal, things with legs, things that are round, things that float.
- I went shopping and I bought (food, things from space, animals etc)
- Word of the day - pick a word and see who can use it in a sentence the most.
- Jokes - tell jokes and make up jokes.
- Word association - pick a word and take turns to say something associated with it e.g. tree- squirrel -nuts - bolts- car - mechanic
- Watching TV - can they tell you a word they think you might not know, describe a character, compare two characters.
- Letter and category game - choose a category and think of a letter, think of as many as possible e.g. animals beginning with 'a' - armadillo, antelope, aardvark.
- Silly and sensible sentences - think of a word and put it in a sensible sentence and a silly sentence e.g. 'Europe is a continent' and 'Europe lives in a dark cave'.
- Unfortunately and fortunately game - take it in turns to tell a story. First person starts with a sentence 'fortunately $\qquad$ '; next person continues the story with 'unfortunately.......' and so on.
- Don't read a story but tell a story from your mouth - simple straightforward, children enjoy hearing about themselves as a character in a story!!!
