Subject/ Theme	Learning ideas and activities
English	<p><u>Spellings</u> <u>The /ee/ sound spelled '-ey' (list 25).</u> key donkey monkey chimney valley trolley journey turkey jockey kidney</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ These spellings will be on spelling shed. ➤ Have a go at the spelling activity using a dice or getting an adult to choose. <p><u>Reading</u> Please have a look and use the e-books on these websites, they are free to access! https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/books/free-ebooks/ https://readon.myon.co.uk/library/browse.html</p> <p><u>Diary (recount)</u> Write a diary entry about what you have been up to. It can be for a day or for a few days over the week. Don't forget to write in the first person and the past tense. Try to include lots of details by using adjectives, expanded noun phrases (2A sentences) adverbs and verbs.</p>
Maths	<p><u>Time</u> I have uploaded three maths activities that revise fractions and measurement that we have covered this year. These are word problems and will help the children apply their maths knowledge to problem solving.</p> <p>There are three extra sheets to revise telling the time. Drawing times - quarter past and quarter to Write the time - o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to Writing times to 5 minutes</p>
Science, History or Geography	<p><u>Great Explorers</u> We have been learning about the continents and oceans in geography.
