
Subject/ Theme	Learning ideas and activities
English	Read the story 'I want my hat back' by Jon Klassen. You can listen to it using: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PdIDYvDP-oY
	There is also a puppet version to watch -

	Can you find some different hats in your house? Choose one of them to help you make up your own story about some-one who has lost their hat.
	The bear who has lost his hat needs to make a wanted poster. Can you help with some ideas - a description of the hat and where it was lost. (See 'Missing poster' in resources section.)
	Can you find another story about a bear to read e.g. 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' or 'Old Bear' or 'Paddington Bear?'
	Phonics - Revise words containing the trigraph -tch. Use the beginner or tricky 'tch' worksheets in the resources to read words and underline the trigraph. Tricky words - want, have, back. Use activities mentioned in our 'Spellings' powerpoint on the Year 1 home learning page to practise these.

	The weekly Thrive document has lots of fun activities that you can do with your family and the people you live with.
Maths	Can you say the months of the year in order? Can you sing them using https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=v608v42dKeI ? Can you conduct a survey and find out which month different members of your family celebrate their birthday?
	Have a look at a clock. Can you find the face, the hands - short (hour) and long (minute?) Can you count around the clock in intervals of five minutes? Can you
	recognise when the clock is showing o'clock or half past? Can you use the worksheets

(in resources) to draw the long and short hands to show these times? You could make your own clock using the template or using paper plates and paper fasteners - (see resources.)

Science, History or Geography

Science - Food chains. Watch https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/z96r82p to learn more about food chains. Can you think of a different food chain? Look at the food web below to give you some ideas. Can you make a mobile with the predator at the top and the other animals and plants below? There is a food chain mobile to cut and make in the resources using a bluetit, caterpillars and leaves.



Science - 1st June sees the start of 30 days wild run by the 'Wild Trusts.' We have included a window poster to colour, a pack of '30 acts of wildness' and a wall chart for you to record your activities. More to follow next week!

Geography - Can you use the cards to match the bears to the habitat? There are also some information cards about different types of bear. Once you have looked at these maybe you could use the world map to find whereabouts each bear is found.

History - What has President Theodore Roosevelt got to do with teddy bears? See if you can find out about this story
