## Children in Reception will be learning to:

	Key Vocabulary	
1	Lent	Lent is the period of six weeks (40 days not including Sundays) leading up to <b>Easter</b> , the most important festival in the Christian calendar. Lent starts on <b>Ash</b> <b>Wednesday</b> . The last week of Lent is called <b>Holy Week</b> .
2	Shrove Tuesday	The day before Lent starts.
3	Ash Wednesday	The first day of Lent.
4	Pancakes	Pancakes became associated with Shrove Tuesday as they were a simple meal that could use up all the eggs, fats and milk in the house with just the addition of flour.
5	Good Friday	Good Friday is the Friday before Easter Sunday. It commemorates the execution of Jesus by <b>crucifixion</b> .
6	Easter Sunday	Easter Sunday marks Jesus's <b>resurrection</b> . After Jesus was crucified on the Friday his body was taken down from the cross and buried in a cave tomb. The tomb was guarded by Roman soldiers and an enormous stone was put over the entrance. On Sunday <b>Mary Magdalene</b> and some of Jesus's disciples visited the tomb. They found the stone had been moved and that Jesus's body had gone. Jesus was seen later that day by Mary and the disciples, and for forty days afterwards by many people. His followers realised that God had raised Jesus from the dead. Christians call this the resurrection.
7	Celebration	To participate in special enjoyable activities in order to show that a particular occasion is important.
