Baptism - A celebration in church for welcoming and blessing a new baby. (see Key Facts) Celebration - To do something special for an important event

Font - usually found at the back of the church, containing water that is used during Baptism Nationality - people who live in the same country and share the same history, traditions and language Occasion - a time when something special happens Temple - a building used for worshipping God

Key Facts:

- During a Baptism service, a baby becomes a child of God
 and is welcomed into the church family. Parents and godparents gather around
 the baptismal font. The priest makes the sign of the cross on the baby's
 forehead using holy oil. Water is blessed and then poured three times over
 the baby's head as a sign that all sin is being washed away. The baby is usually
 dressed in white to show that they are now free from sin. A baptismal candle
 is presented to the baby to help the, remember that Jesus is the light of the
 world.
- Forty days after Jesus was born, Mary and Joseph took him to the temple in Jerusalem to be presented.
- Everyone can be in God's family.
- A number of different celebrations take place in church as well as acts of worship such as saying prayers, singing hymns and reading from the Bible.
