

Assessments

- Practitioners knowledge of children: assessment is based primarily on the practitioner's knowledge of what the child knows, remembers and can do day to day.
- Summative: assessment is based on the holistic view of what the child can demonstrate against each ELG at the end of the reception year. When assessing children against the ELGs, teachers look at the whole description for each goal to determine whether this best fits their professional knowledge of the child.
- Reception Baseline Assessment: the purpose of the assessment is to provide the starting point for a new measure of progress between reception and year 6/end of key stage 2. The RBA is a short, interactive and practical assessment completed in the first 6 weeks of your child starting reception. It assesses your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school. It was made statutory from September 2021




Tapestry



Tapestry is an online learning journal which your child's class teacher uploads to. Tapestry builds a very special of a child's experiences, development and learning journey through their early years. Using photos, videos and comments, we can along with you as parents 'weave' the story of the child and how they are growing and developing in line with the early years foundation stage. Parents are able to view online their child's progress and how much fun they're having, whilst also uploading their own comments and media. Home learning should be submitted via tapestry.

Tapestry will be rolled out to parents week beginning 26th September by the IT team.



Home Learning Expectations

As you will have experienced in previous weeks; on the learning intentions you will see home learning suggestions to complete to support learning. Evidence of your child completing this and/or the finished product can be uploaded onto Tapestry.

Reading books:

Your child will be provided with reading books throughout the school year. There is an expectation that you read with your child daily and **sign** the bookmark provided in their reading folder. Mrs Peacock will change the books on a Monday and Thursday if your child has filled in their bookmark correctly to evidence reading.



Parent drop in's

At various point's in the academic year you will be invited to a parent drop in session, where you can observe teaching and complete activities along side your child. The first drop in will be in October with a focus on phonics and early reading following the Sounds-Write programme. These drop in sessions are very informative and show you how we teach children within school.

The date for the phonics and early reading drop in will be confirmed and communicated nearer the time. It would be a pleasure to see as many of you there as possible.



New phonics scheme – Sounds Write

- New scheme being rolled out across both schools in the federation
- Starts with sounds not spellings
- Children are taught to listen to sounds in words and then taught the spellings that make those sounds
- Phonics lessons being taught across the school from EYs to Y6 (alphabet code knowledge, alternative spellings, polysyllabic words)
- Main differences – precise pronunciation, sounds taught in context of words and not in isolation, no pictures or actions to represent sounds, no teaching of rules
- Teaching sequence constantly builds on prior knowledge and gives time to rehearse and practise




Reading

- There are no colour levels as we have had previously
- New decodable books have been purchased to allow children to practice the sounds that they have been taught in school
- Children will have been explicitly taught sounds and will have had practise of reading and writing these sounds in the classroom
- Books they bring home will therefore be practising words they already have seen and learnt
- Aim is that they can read the books



Spellings

- Spellings will be sent home as another way of the children practising what they have learnt and practised in the classroom
- Spellings to be learnt will come home showing you how they are split into their sounds or syllables
- Words coming home are those that all children are expected to spell accurately, both individually and in the context of written sentences
- “Say the sounds and write the word.”
- No longer practising spellings with ‘look, cover, write, check’, rainbow writing etc.



Physical Education

- PE kit – Please come into school in PE kit on Wednesdays. As per the uniform list this should be black plimsols/trainers, white t-shirt and navy shorts, black or navy joggers and hoody in the winter.
- Earrings – please do not wear them on PE days (*if they are worn, then children must be able to take them out independently*).
- *Reception also have an additional 90 minutes across the week timetabled to support your child's gross motor skills.*

Please ensure that all items of uniform are labelled clearly.



Forest school

Forest school is on a Friday afternoon with Mrs Harding and Mrs Peacock. Please make sure that your child comes into school in:

- Joggers or leggings.
- Jumper or hoodie.
- Waterproof coat/All-in-one suit.
- Wellies or old trainers.



Other Information

- Please make sure that all children's coats, jumpers/cardigans, bags, water bottles, lunchboxes are labelled with their name.
- Children are allowed to bring in their own snack, this should be a piece of fruit, or there is snack provided daily by the school. Children should only have water in their water bottle, milk is provided until the age of 5.
- Smart walking.
- The three R's – ready, respectful and responsible.
- Learning Intentions – once a week containing information about the following week.
- Children in Reception and KS1 are eligible for free school meals, it is encouraged that your child tries the school meals, however if your child would prefer a packed lunch we understand.
- I am still learning faces at the gate. Thank you for your patience at pick up time.
